## A. Improvement of Academic Achievement

o Schedule for Trimester 3

The school continues to receive requests for students to return to in person learning. Last week social distancing guidelines were relaxed to 3 feet. Students are attending 4 days a week in person. Starting April 19<sup>th</sup> students will start in person 5 days per week with shortened days and on May 17<sup>th</sup> 5 full days with lunch and recess. Remote teachers are coming back in the building, those teachers will teach both in person and remote students will stream in to the classes. About 24% of the overall student population remains remote learning.

• Extended Day (T/R) Student Support

Students who need targeted or small group instruction based on teacher recommendation will be staying later at school on Tuesdays/Thursdays with lunch in the building and then go to the teacher until 2:45 pm.

 Spring Assessment Update (Illinois Assessment of Readiness for students in grades 3-8; the Illinois Science Assessment for studentsin grades 5 & 8; and the ACCESS for English Learners)

IAR, Access and IAS are still happening this year. Testing will be begin after Spring Break.
